Asthma Program

For children (birth-age 17) diagnosed with asthma. Staff visit and work with the family on ways to reduce the child's symptom's, discuss community resources and decrease exposure to triggers in the home.

Child and Teen Checkups (C&TC)

Child and Teen Checkups staff can help find a doctor or dentist, make an appointment, find transportation, or an interpreter for families with children and young adults on Medical Assistance from birth to age 21.

Family Home Visiting

Home visits support families during pregnancy and after delivery. Staff can provide growth and development checks for infants and children, and resources for children with special needs. To apply, call or fill out online form at www.dakotacounty.us (search "home visits").

Follow Along Program

Follows your child's development from birth to 5 years old. Find out if your child is playing, talking, growing, moving, and acting like other children the same age.

Mothers and Babies

Stress reduction program for pregnant people or parenting families with children up to one year old. Parents will build skills to manage stress and promote mental wellbeing. Families with children ages 1-3 may also be considered based on program capacity. Delivered in under 9 visits either in-person or virtually.

Radon Testing

Test your home for radon. Pick up a test kit in Apple Valley or West St. Paul, call 952.891.7500 for availability.

Tuberculosis testing and treatment

Dakota County offers tuberculosis skin tests by appointment. People with tuberculosis can receive medication at no cost.

VACCINES FOR CHILDREN AND ADULTS

Low-cost vaccines for children and adults who:

- Do not have health insurance
- Have health insurance that does not cover vaccines

AND free for children who:

- Are American Indian or Alaskan Native
- Are on a Minnesota Health Care Program (MA, MnCare, or PMAP)

If you have a co-pay or deductible, you are not eligible for the vaccines in this program. Children under 18 years of age MUST be accompanied by a parent or guardian OR have proper written consent. Adults must be Dakota County residents.
